Knowledge and Understanding of the world

To look at some of the animals related to nursery rhymes /stories and explore their habitats

To use the computer to complete a simple task

Physical Development

To learn about different fine motor activities, eg threading, cutting, using tools, holding a pencil, mark making, Dough Disco etc

To mark make in sensory trays and also copy different patterns

To mark make using a comfortable grip when using pencils and pens

To move in different ways, eg climbing, running, jumping etc in order to develop gross motor skills

To hold jugs and containers confidently and pour from one container into another

To show awareness of healthy food choices and impact on our body

Mathematics we will be covering this week:

Subitising to 5

Subitising pictures –

3 and not 3,

4 and not 4,

5 and not 5

Communication and language

To begin to use a wide range of vocabulary in the correct context

To talk in short sentences that others can understand

To listen to, and follow simple instructions and respond to questions appropriately

To join in with simple, well known rhymes and songs

Expressive Arts and design

To use scissors effectively

To begin to act out different scenarios using props to enhance imaginative play

Beginning to construct, stacking blocks vertically and horizontally, making enclosures and creating spaces

To play instruments with increasing control

To explore colour, using a range of basic media and techniques choosing particular colours for a reason

Mathematics

To develop fast recognition of numbers
To subitise to 5

Fast recognition of up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually ('subitising')

Say one number for each item in order:
1,2,3,4,5

Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total ('cardinal principle')

Literacy and Phonics

Aspect 4: Rhythm and rhyme - Tuning into sounds

To talk about and retell a range of familiar stories

To join in with tasks and games that involve hearing, clapping stomping and emphasising the syllables within words
