Mathematics

Number and the number system

Count to 100, forwards and backwards.
Write numbers to 20 as words.
Identify one more and one less.
Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line.
Comparing numbers: equal to, more than, less than, most, least.
Count in 2s, 5s, 10s.
Properties of number; odds and evens
Ordinal numbers: first, second, etc.
Place value – tens and ones (units)
Addition and subtraction
Add and subtract numbers, writing number addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=).
Represent, memorise and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.
Begin to know doubles.
Solve simple one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction



Time – days of the week, months, analogue time
Finding a half/quarter
Geometry – recognising and naming common 2-D shapes
Measures – length and height in any direction. Comparing length and height
Measures – weight and mass. Comparing mass, using the vocabulary light and heavy.

Music

Exploring pulse, rhythm and pitch.
Playing a range of percussion instruments.
Learning new songs. Listening to different styles of music: Blues, Baroque, Latin, Bhangra, Folk and Funk.



P.E.

Throwing and catching. Use a range of equipment.
Develop underarm throw, chest pass, and bounce pass.
Dance – use counts of 8, exploring pathways, actions, repeating, creating own dance.
