Expressive Arts and design

Make large scale representation of vehicles and building using a range of materials and construction kits.

For children to be able to construct with a purpose and safely

To know that objects can be represented by simple marks on a page

To know that using different colour, media and techniques will have different effects

Mathematics

To talk about what happened today, yesterday and tomorrow.

To start to remember some of the days of the week in order

Talk about and explore some 2D shapes using relevant mathematical vocabulary

such as flat/sides/ round/ straight/ corners

To know what the numbers 1,2 then 3 are and can recognise order and count within them

To know that the last number said represents the total number of objects

Literacy and Phonics

To recognise familiar logos and labels within the environment.

To know that text has a meaning.

To name and talk about the different parts of a book, e.g. front cover/ back cover/ spine/ pages.

Phonics - Aspect 2 -

Instrumental **Sound** Discrimination.

Personal, Emotional and Social Development

To talk about themselves and their immediate families.

To know some facts about themselves and their immediate families.

To practice some basic road safety skills.

To learn about simple fire safety with support, begin to look after and treat the nursery resources with growing respect.

To know that they can approach adults in Nursery when needed.
