Knowledge and Understanding of the world.

To learn and sing a range of songs sung in the past

To explore some of the language used in Nursery rhymes

To look at some of the animals related to nursery rhymes and explore their habitats

Physical Development

To learn about different fine motor activities, e.g. threading, cutting, using tools, holding a pencil, mark making etc.

To mark make in sensory trays and also copy different patterns.

To mark make using a comfortable grip when using pencils and pens.

To move in different ways, e.g. climbing, running, jumping etc. in order to develop gross motor skills.

To hold jugs and containers confidently and pour from one container into another.

Mathematics we will be covering this term:

Recognising and counting number 4
Shapes - Square, rectangle, rhombus, pentagon
Recognising and counting number 5.
One more and less within 5 – Number facts

Communication and language

To begin to use a wide range of vocabulary in the correct context.

To talk in short sentences that others can understand.

To listen to, and follow simple instructions and respond to questions appropriately.

To join in with simple, well known rhymes and songs

Expressive Arts and design

To use scissors effectively.

To begin to act out different scenarios using props to enhance imaginative play.

Sing familiar songs or make up own songs.

Sing familiar Nursery Rhymes and copy/add any relevant actions.

Mathematics

To know the numbers 4 and 5, counting ordering and knowing the value of each

To subitise to 5.

Fast recognition of up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually ('subitising').

Link numerals and amounts: for example, showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5

Talk about and explore some 2D shapes using relevant mathematical vocabulary
