## Year 6 SATs week

Dear Parents/Carers,
Here is the timetable for the week beginning $13^{\text {th }}$ May 2019 when pupils in Year 6 will take the national SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests). It is essential that children attend school each day this week; if children miss any assessments, rearrangements for them to sit the test at another time will be made.

Every morning, the assessments will start at 9am promptly and it is extremely important that ALL pupils arrive punctually so that they are not rushing to begin the tests. These are administered by the government every year to monitor the attainment of pupils in Mathematics and English when leaving primary school.

During SATs week, the children will have a more flexible timetable (with many more sporting and craft activities) in order to reduce any anxiety that they may face from sitting formal tests. In addition, on the final day of SATs week, we will have a 'Reward Day' with treats to recognise the pupils' achievements and dedication.

We should receive the results of these tests towards the middle of July. As soon as we receive the results, we will share these with the pupils and discuss their attainment with them in detail. Results are given as raw scores and scaled scores; parents/carers will be informed whether their child is at the expected standard for a Y 6 child, below the expected standard for a Y 6 child and/or above the expected standard for a Y6 child (i.e. greater depth).

When pupils move on to their secondary school, these scores are passed on through our electronic pupil information transfer systems. During the summer term, we will pass on pupils' test scores when we liaise with their secondary school.
