

Nursery Newsletter

Friday 3rd May

We have had a lovely week learning all about Pirates. We have listened to the story of 'Pirate Pete and his Parrot' amongst others, made lots of pirate crafts such as pirate ships that float and we learnt why pirates wore eye patches and came up with some lovely ideas of our own. All day children have been learning all about space following the story of Aliens love underpants.



Next week we will be starting our new topic of Minibeasts and will be looking at all things that are slithery and slimy, we will be learning about slugs, snails and worms. If your child has any slug, snail or worm books at home they would like to share with the class please bring them in. Please make sure they are named. The children can bring in snails they have found in their gardens if they are very keen, we will have a tank in the classroom to observe them over the week.



Could we ask that you send in cooking money (£2) for this term in a named envelope.

We are planning to start making scones next week. Please be aware that we can only cook with 5/6 children at a time, all children will get a chance, it may take a few weeks to complete all the groups.

If anyone has any recipes that their children enjoy making at home please let us know, we are always looking for new recipes.

In Numeracy we will be looking at numbers to 1-10, length and size. In Phonics we will be looking at the letters recapping EHRMD, please have a look at these letters at home too.

Could we please remind you that long hair needs to be tied up every day and children should not be wearing necklaces/rings etc. in school.

Beans and lentils – if anyone has any out of date dried beans or lentils please send them in for our craft activities.

Water bottles – all children should have a water bottle in school every day, especially as it is getting warmer. **Please ensure all water bottles are named clearly.**

Chicken pox – This time last year quite a few children in Nursery came down with Chicken pox, it is the time of year for it! Most of the children had had a cold and temperature then the spots started a few days later so please keep an eye on your children and get ready for the spots. Chicken pox is highly contagious, unfortunately it is most contagious before the spots come out. If your child does get Chickenpox they will have to be off school until all the spots have crusted over. Please note that ibuprofen based medicines should not be given as it aggravates the spots and makes it worse. Bicarbonate of soda in the bath helps to dry them out and calamine cream will ease the itching.
