Welcome to the Nursery Newsletter, each week you will find out what we have been doing in the week and what we will be learning during the following week, it will also include any important dates and notices. We hope you will find this both informative and useful. It will be sent home via e-mail every Friday (once all email addresses are on the school system) and will be available to view on the school website.

Next week we will be focussing on our listening skills, particularly distinguishing between different sounds. Please encourage your child to talk about what they can hear at home and when you are out and about at the park/supermarket etc. We will continue to talk about the sounds they have heard in and around Nursery.

We will also be learning about the number 1 and the circle shape.

Our topic next week is families and celebrations, we will also be talking about people who are important to us. We are planning to make some textured photo frames next week, and so for our first request, could you

please send in a family photo that we could put in the frames we make, they will ideally need to be 6 x 4 in order to fit the frames. When we receive the photos you will have to look out for 'Our Family' display.



As the weather begins to get a bit colder please be aware that the children in Nursery tend to spend quite a bit of time outside, if it looks like it could be chilly/wet please send in a coat and welly boots which are clearly named.

Please could you send in the 'All about me' booklets if you haven't already done so, we will be using them next week when we talk about our families.

Could I also please remind you that all drink bottles, snack boxes, coats, jumpers and spare clothes need to be clearly named. We have already had parents telling us about missing jumpers, please ensure you check your child has come home in the correct jumper every day. Literally everything needs to be names including snack boxes and individual pieces of fruit. All day children should place their water bottle and fruit snack in the black and yellow trolley and lunchboxes need to go on the big blue trolley.

All children should also be wearing plimsolls in Nursery every day. No trainers or hard soled shoes. (fingers get do tend to get trodden on!)

Cooking Money – Each term we like to do some cooking activities and ask that all parents contribute £2 towards ingredients for this term's cooking activities. Please send in £2 in a named envelope and give it to a member of staff.

Grapes- if you send in grapes for your child either for snack time or lunch please ensure you cut them in half lengthways as whole grapes are a choking hazard particularly for small children.

Now that the children have been in Nursery for a few days we would ask that from Monday you say goodbye to your child at the outside door, this will encourage the children to become more independent and reduce the number of people in the cloakroom area, as it does get a bit congested in the morning particularly. This will enable us to begin the session much more quickly and with much less disruption. When collecting your child please wait outside the Nursery leaving the doorway clear so that we can see the parents as you collect your child.

Lost Jumpers. Nathan has lost 2 jumpers this week, they are age 5-6 and are labelled. Please could you check the jumpers you have at home. We also have two jumpers age 4-5 with no names in them, if you have lost one please let us know.
