Welcome to the Nursery Newsletter! Each week you will find out what we have been doing in the week and what we will be learning during the following week, it will also include any important dates and notices. We have had a lovely week learning about our senses of sight and hearing. We have looked at our eyes and that eyes are different colours, we have been listening to sounds around us and talked about why some children have hearing aids or cochlea implants.



The children have loved exploring a range of different musical instruments and we linked this to our phonics activities.

Next week we will be learning all about our senses of taste and smell, we will be making smelly pictures using herbs and spices. We will also be learning about the number 3 and the triangle shape.



We will be tasting different fruits such as pineapple, mango, kiwi, apple and pears. We will be deciding on our favourite fruits and make a class bar chart. 'All day' children will be tasting pizza. Cheese, ham and pepperoni topped pizza. If your child cannot eat any of these fruits or pizzas, please let a member of Nursery staff know or message us via ClassDojo.

On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> October and Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> October we will be having parent's consultations over the phone, appointment slips will be sent home next week. It is an opportunity to discuss how your child has settled into Nursery over the last few weeks. Our appointment slots are limited to 5 minutes as there are so many children in the Nursery and I will do my best to keep to the time slot allocated to you. If you have not yet returned your slip and would like an appointment, please return it next week.

As the weather begins to get a bit colder, please be aware that the children in Nursery tend to spend quite a bit of time outside, please send in a coat every day and welly boots if it is wet, all of which need to be clearly named.



Could I also please remind you that all drink bottles, snack boxes, jumpers and spare clothes all need to be clearly named. We have already had parents telling us about missing jumpers, please ensure you check your child has come home in the correct jumper every day. Literally everything needs to be named including snack boxes and individual pieces of fruit.



On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October, it is 'Hello Yellow' day, the children are asked to wear something yellow to raise awareness for young people's mental health. So wear non-uniform with something yellow and bring in £1, which will be donated to Young Minds.
