With this in mind, we will continue to work with the children on resilience and 'bouncing back' from disappointments as well as focussing on building stamina in their learning.



### **School Photos**

Individual and family photos (with any primary school-age siblings only) for children in Nursery – Year 5 will be taken on **Monday** (10<sup>th</sup>). Please ensure your child is in full school uniform (there will be no PE lessons on the day).

### **Self-isolation Guidance**

This continues to be tricky to navigate as it changes so frequently but I thought the graphic below may help you if you are in this position:



Staff and pupils can take an LFD test from 6 days after the day their symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if they did not have symptoms), and another LFD test on the following day. The second LFD test should be taken at least 24 hours later. If both these test results are negative, and they do not have a high temperature, they may end self-isolation immediately after the second negative test result.

They should stop testing after they have had 2 consecutive negative test results and can return to their education setting on the 7th day if they have tested negative in the morning.

### **Parking**

I have received an email from a parent along with photographic evidence of a Glebe parent's car parked on the white zig zag lines of the zebra crossing.

The position of the car meant that it was obstructing the crossing from oncoming traffic, which is putting not only the families using the crossing in danger but the drivers approaching the crossing as their view of the crossing is obscured by the car.

Not only is this illegal, it is highly dangerous for the pupils who are making their way to school. Many of our older pupils are gaining independence by walking to school unaccompanied and I am seriously concerned that no amount of their own common sense and road safety awareness will protect them if they are not seen by drivers whose view of them is obscured by parents parking illegally.

It's only a matter of time before someone gets seriously injured or worse, all for the sake of having to park up and walk a few extra metres to get your child into school. At the time this photo was taken, there were ample spaces slightly further along the road (it was towards the end of drop off time) which makes this even more unacceptable.

I'm sorry to have to start the new year with this tone but I am increasingly concerned about something serious happening to someone due to the thoughtless actions of another. I have included the photo, see below, but have obscured the registration but I'm afraid safeguarding of my pupils is paramount.

We have enjoyed PE this week!














We've been busy looking at the features of diary entries in English, ready to write our own diaries about the Great Fire of London.
