We are still expanding as a school and have employed more staff to support us in addressing the issues caused by the disruption to the children's learning over the past two years. 






In English, we made freeze frames of how to fly a broomstick!






This week, we read 'Escape from Pompeii' and created text maps and wrote setting descriptions.
