Safer Neighbourhood Police Team

I have received a letter which I have been asked to send to all parents from the Safer Neighbourhood Team of the Metropolitan Police. They have had numerous complaints and reports about parents at Glebe, ranging from anti-social parking (across driveways and on grass verges) to illegal activity (excessive speeding on the roads around school at the end of the school day when there are children around). I, myself, have received **5** complaints just **this week** from residents or parents about Glebe parents being, at best, inconsiderate and, at worst, verbally abusive and dangerous.

Please think about where you park, how you park and how you drive on the surrounding roads. As adults, we are role models for the children and, as I have said on this newsletter many times, we work hard in school to ensure the children are civil to one another and maintain rules for their own safety and that of others. As their parents, they expect you to lead by example and do the same.

I will set you a challenge, if you can all park and drive safely and appropriately for half a term (at least) I'll give you a break from listening to me moan about it!

Behaviour Management & Anti-Bullying

You may remember last January we launched a system to help the children, staff and parents identify and deal with various forms of inappropriate behaviour. The initiative has been very successful and the children have embraced the vocabulary and are able to articulate and reflect on unwanted behaviours. I just wanted to re-share it with our families so that you can re-familiarise yourselves with the vocabulary we use with the children in school.

For those families who are new to Glebe, we brought in this initiative as we believe it is really important for the children to have the emotional literacy and appropriate vocabulary to describe what has happened to them when an incident occurs.

I have attached two parental guidance documents with this newsletter, one details the system and the vocabulary we will be using and the other is more general information on identifying the different types of bullying. These are also available on our website.

The Queen received her first Corgi, Susan, as an 18th birthday present. She loved that breed of dog throughout her life, going on to own another 30 of them.



As Britain was still recovering from the effects of the war, the young Princess Elizabeth had to save ration coupons to buy the material for her wedding dress!

The Queen took the unusual step of inviting a TV documentary crew into Buckingham Palace in 1969. This let people see the Royal Family in a way they'd never been able to before.



In 1982, a mentally ill man broke into the palace and reached the Queen's bedroom! Reports suggest Her Majesty calmly kept him talking for 10 minutes until the security team arrived.



It was Queen Elizabeth who, in 1993, decided to open up Buckingham Palace to visitors from the public for the first time.

To help launch the 2012 Olympics in London, Her Majesty featured in a short film where she meets super-spy James Bond, as played by Daniel Craig.
