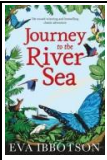




Recommended Reads For Year 5

There are rumours that the Birdman is dangerous. When Gracie & Daniel can't find a place to sail their boats, they come to him...



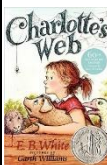
Percy Jackson & The Lightning Thief by Rick Riordan

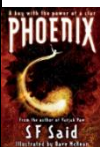
Charlotte's Web by EB White

From cub to sled dog to fighting dog, his journey is long & hard - yet deep down he has memories of love & slowly, after forming a bond with his owner, they start to resurface.



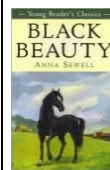
The High Rise Mystery by Sharna Jackson

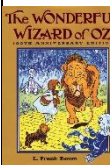
Five Children and It by E.B. Nesbit

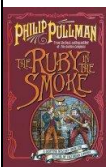
Black Beauty by Anna Sewell

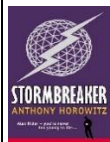
The Ruby in The Smoke by Philip Pullman

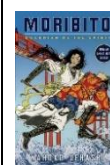
Inkheart by Cornelia Funke

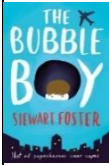

Darkmouth by Shane Hegarty

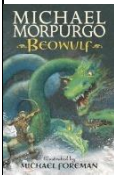

The Bubble Boy by Stewart Foster

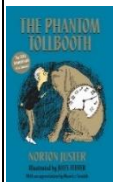

from 9+.



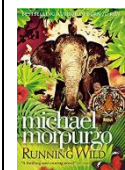
A Girl Called Owl by Amy Wilson

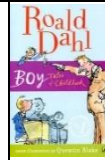
Dealing With Dragons by Patricia C Wrede

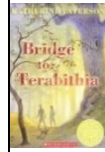
Running Wild by Michael Morpurgo

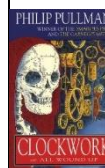
Bridge to Terabithia by Katherine Paterson

Jess Aarons wants to be the fastest boy in the class, but when a girl named Leslie Burke moves into the neighbouring farm his life changes forever.



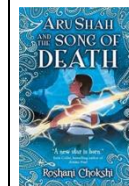
Who Let The Gods Out by Maz Evans

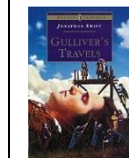
Clockwork by Phillip Pullman

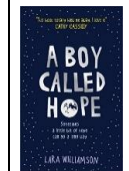
Aru Shah & the Song of Death by Roshani Chokshi

Gulliver's Travels by Jonathan Swift

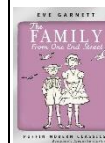
