 1:1 or group tutoring Overview: Bespoke tuition tailored to Pupil Premium children in line with their individualised targets. Further develop and embed a range of targeted and universal interventions with a focus on reading, writing and maths. Aims/outcomes: Through bespoke intervention using 1:1 precision teaching as well as group interventions; children develop their phonetic, writing, reading and mathematical skills. 	£44,900.00	 The 1:1 and group interventions have been effective with some children more than others. Children have been engaged in their task and applied this learning into their classwork. Some children have been reluctant to attend initially, therefore this has impacted on their results in termly assessments. Across the school, data in reading, writing and maths for pupil premium pupils (21%) is significantly lower in comparison to non-pupil premium pupils (61%). Furthermore, reading with an LSA daily throughout the week has built confidence in the pupils' reading ability and comprehension skills. 		
 Phonics interventions Overview: Phonics sessions targeted at disadvantaged pupils in KS1 and KS2. These sessions will be provided to the pupils who require further phonics support and is delivered by an experienced teacher. Aims/outcomes: Children develop their vocabulary, which in turn will develop their writing and reading skills. 	£7,479.18	Phonics interventions have proved to be successful with pupils progressing well. Children have focused on fluency, positional vocabulary comprehensions skills and extending vocabulary. Children have gained more confidence in their reading ability and are beginning to derive pleasure from a range of books.		



Local library visits Overview: Reluctant readers visit the local library to engage them in reading for pleasure as well as reading-based activities. Aims/outcomes: Children develop their vocabulary, which in turn will develop their writing and reading skills.	£3000.00	Reluctant readers who attended the local library visits enjoyed a range of activities organised by the library. Children have further attended the library in their own time and chose books of their choice. The library visits have decreased due to change in management in the library, therefore visits will hopefully resume the following year.
 Precision teaching Overview: Bespoke tuition tailored to Pupil Premium children in line with their individualised targets. Focus on upper key stage two students, to further develop their writing and maths skills. Aims/outcomes: Through bespoke intervention using 1:1 precision teaching interventions; children develop their spelling, punctuation and grammar skills in writing. 	£260.90	 Children in Upper Key Stage 2 have been focusing on writing and maths. In writing, areas of focus included expanding sentences using a story stimulus and use of figurative language. Furthermore, use of advanced punctuation (semi-colons, colons and parenthesis). In Maths, focus has been on calculation methods for place value and percentages. These interventions have been on a 1:1 basis which has allowed children to gain confidence in their ability and build on their skills and knowledge.



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Subsidised school trips Overview: School trips to be subsidised for children if needed. Aim/Outcomes: Children to have access to all school trips provided, thus enriching these children's life experiences; experiences they can draw upon in their learning.	£7,526.82 (dependent on cost of individual trip)	Pupil premium pupils were able to attend school trips throughout the year which has enhanced their learning and provided valuable memorable experiences. All pupil premium pupils who wished to go on the Year 6 residential trip had their place paid for.
Afterschool clubs (cardio club) Overview: After-school sessions with specialist PSD staff to enable children to develop their fitness and stamina. Aims/outcomes: Develop the confidence in physical education as well as developing their mental, emotional and social wellbeing.	£135	All pupil pupils have access to cardio club which is run during school hours and after school. Activities include tennis, netball, football, basketball, reaction games and sports to enhance gross motor skills. Pupils have enjoyed participating in the club and we will be looking to see if there will be any other opportunities for clubs in the future.
Uniform Overview: Children to receive school uniform (school PE shirt, jumper and/or fleece) if required. Aims/outcomes: Parents supported financially and some also believe that a uniform promotes social equity.	£2,596	All pupil premium families were offered the opportunity to request pre-loved or new uniform. This was successful as families were able to relieve some financial strain as the school were able to provide uniform for the pupils.
