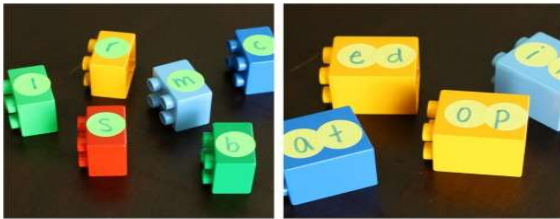


# Activities for CVC words

## 1. Duplo Word Building

Place a sticker with a sound from the Jolly Phonics on a duplo brick. Your child can build a word using the letters. The words can be as difficult as they can manage.



## 2. Phonic Catch

Cover a ball with stickers/post it notes with letters or words on them, throw the ball to your child, once they have caught it, they have to identify the sounds/words under their hands.



## 3. CVC/Sight Word Stomp -

Write CVC words or high frequency sight words on pieces of paper. Spread them on the floor, call out a word and your child has to find it and stomp on it.



#### 4. Post-it note Hunt -

Write sounds or words onto post-it notes and stick around the room. Call out a sound/word and your child has to find it and bring it back to you and tell you what it says.



#### 5. Word Necklaces -

Using beads with letters on them (Tesco) and the thread provided, your child can build words and make chains. Not only will this develop their phonic skills, it will also help them to further develop important fine motor skills which will help them with pencil control and writing.

#### 6. Playdough phonics-

Call out sounds and encourage children to stamp letters onto playdough to spell simple words. Ask them to blend the word together.



7. Magnetic letter/ letter shapes

Using magnetic letters (with the vowels in a different colour) encourage children to make a 3 letter word using a vowel in the middle. Use a sound box to help children with segmenting simple words.



8. Read, build, write-

Write simple words on paper. Ask children to read the word, then build the word (using magnetic letter, scrabble letter then ask children to write the word).
