## 20mph Zone Consultation

Hillingdon council are consulting on plans to introduce a 20 mph zone near Glebe. However, this seems to only be on Glebe Avenue and Sussex Avenue at present. I know many of our families walk to school and I have mentioned speed issues on surrounding roads in previous newsletters.

Austin's Lane is particularly hazardous as there is no pavement for large parts of the road. The council has been approached previously about installing a path along Austin's lane, but has never been agreed or actioned, so if they would consider making this road also 20mph then it would be a lot safer for everyone.
