







Sharing our Stories project

Through the 2021 Autumn Term, a group of Year 6's have been working with theatre practitioner, Hannah Wood, to put together a short Zoom performance for Parkfield House Nursing Home. The funding for the project was secured by Parkfield House Nursing Home from The National Lottery Local Connections Fund, specifically aimed towards linking residents at Parkfield with pupils at Glebe.

The aims of the project were:

- to increase opportunities for older people to work with their local community, including school children, particularly in a digital capacity
- to work with artists to explore experiences and ideas through creativity, which will add to a feeling of purpose and achievement
- bring joy and comfort to older residents, whilst increasing empathy and pride in younger people
- to build meaningful exchanges between young and older people to lift spirits and build cross-generational relationships within our local community

The project saw residents at Parkfield Housing Nursing Home do weekly poetry and spoken word sessions with a professional poet, Daisy, and Year 6 pupils take part in weekly drama workshops with Hannah. To celebrate the end of the project, we linked up with residents at Parkfield House via Zoom. In the Zoom session, the Year 6s led a physical and vocal warm up for Parkfield residents, played a drama game and then read and performed some of the residents' poems back to them.
