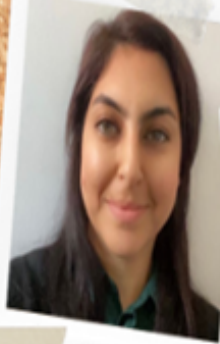

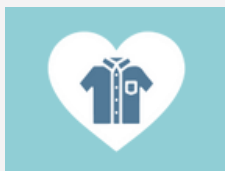

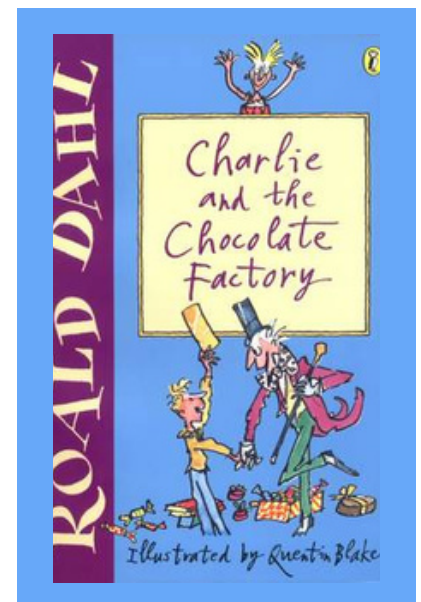
GOLDEN TICKET

Our experience of Verulamium was fabulous! We went on a coach and on the way we saw the Roman road, Watling Street. When we got there, we went to the hypocaust which had a huge mosaic across the floor (we discovered that it was made out of 220,000 tiles!) After we explored the mosaic, we went into the museum.

Inside the museum are different rooms that showed how people lived in the time of the Romans. We saw Roman pots, buried bodies, Roman coins and armour. Some of the jobs in Roman times were farming, carpentry and tapestry.

We then had a workshop where we got to hold Roman artefacts.

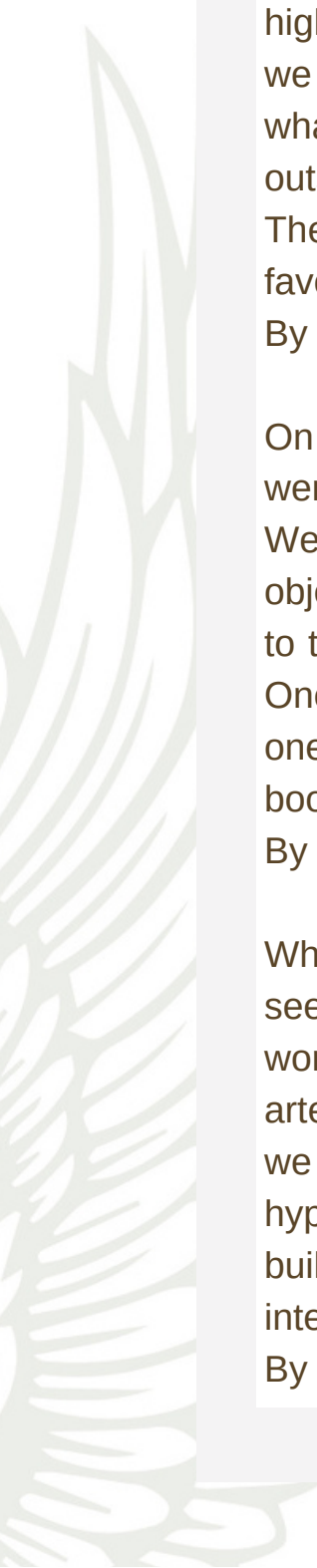

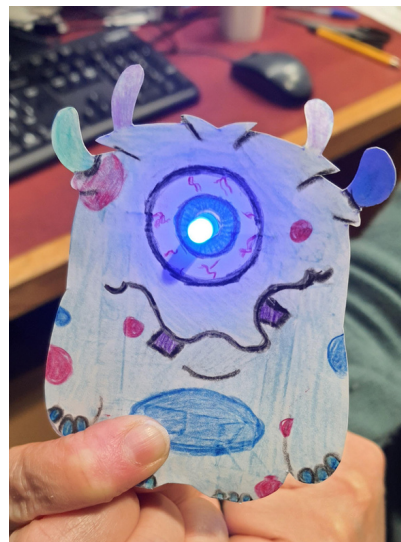
Library Trip
