Dangerous Driving in Surrounding Roads

I have had reports of two incidents of dangerous driving this week. The first incident involved 7 cars mounting the kerb to get passed stationary traffic - one of the cars actually brushed the arm and leg of a Glebe parent - fortunately, no one was hurt but as I've said before, it's only a matter of time.



The second incident actually involved my son who was on the zebra crossing on Sussex Road yesterday at the end of the school day and a car came speeding around the corner, continued to move at speed so he stopped on the crossing as he didn't think the female driver had seen him or was going to stop. The Glebe parents then proceeded to verbally abuse him.
