
World Book Day

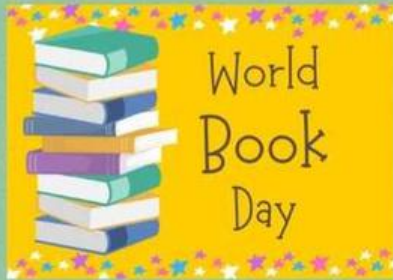

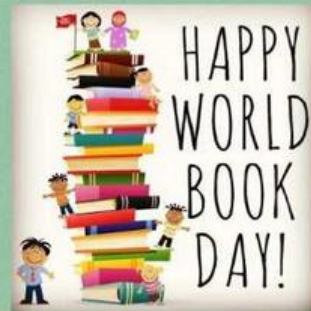
