- Writing is teacher assessed everything else is purely based on the exams.
- However, in the summer term, the year 6 teachers will meet the tutors from your child's secondary school to discuss your child's day to day practice- their strengths, areas to develop, friendships etc.

Grading

- Your child's test score is converted into a standardised score (100 is the pass mark).
- ► They receive 1 of 3 scores:
 - Below age related expectations
 - At age related expectations
 - OAbove age related expectations.






