Years 1,3,5 and some of the nursery children got to meet them and they got a real buzz out of their visit. Years Reception, 2 and 4 had an assembly with Mr Khan, who told us all about animals from the tropical rainforest. He also showed us some of the amazing creatures he had brought in!



Year 6 had visiting Biology, Chemistry and Physics teachers from Vyners, who had a carousel of exciting experiments and investigations for the children to take part in. They worked as teams to build a Rube Goldberg machine, built robotic hands and made a red cabbage indicator, which included testing the PH to identify acid and alkaline solutions.

Year 5 Victorian Day

Year 5 had a fantastic Victorian Day, immersing themselves in the experiences of life in Victorian Britain. Each class took part in an engaging drama-based workshop, where they learned about famous Victorian inventions, influential figures such as Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Dr Barnardo. They also considered the contrasting lives of the rich and poor during the period.

Throughout the day, the children enjoyed a range of exciting history activities. They became detectives in a Victorian court case, working together to identify the mysterious watch thief and explored the fascinating world of Victorian crime and punishment. They also discovered what school life was like for Victorian children and even practised Victorian-style handwriting - with the strict rule that no left-handed writing was allowed!

The children also had the opportunity to investigate some of the era's most important inventions before putting their own creativity to the test in a Victorian Dragon's Den challenge. Working as inventors, they designed their own inventions and pitched their ideas to a panel of successful Victorian businessmen.

Overall, Year 5 had an incredible day stepping into the shoes of Victorians. The experience brought their history learning to life and the children came away having learned so much about this fascinating period in British history.

Glebe Hockey Team Claim Silver at West London Finals

The Glebe Hockey Team proudly represented Hillingdon at the West London Finals, producing an outstanding display of teamwork, determination, and skill to finish as runners-up and secure a well-deserved silver medal.

Glebe got off to a flying start in their opening match, defeating Grimsdyke 6-1. The goals came from Harley, Fletcher (2), and Luka, who completed a superb hat-trick with three goals of his own.

The second match saw Glebe face eventual champions Charville Primary. Despite a strong effort, Glebe were beaten 3-1 in what proved to be the decisive match of the tournament.

Showing great character, Glebe bounced back brilliantly in their next game against Hammersmith Primary, recording an emphatic 7-1 victory. Fletcher and Keira both scored twice, while Luka continued his excellent form by adding another hat-trick.

Next came a hard-fought 2-2 draw against St Vincent's, Ealing. Harley and Fletcher were on the scoresheet as Glebe battled to earn an important point.

Parent Parking Permits

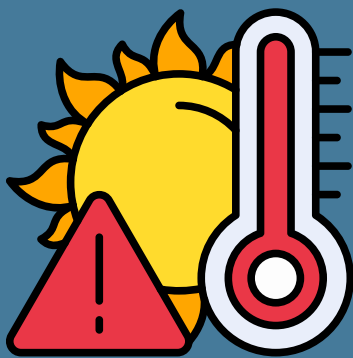

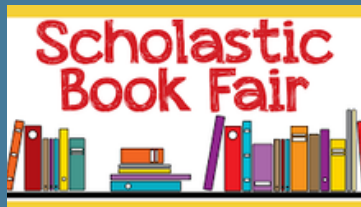


Sports Day - Heat Contingencies
