

Glebe Primary School – Key Stage 1 and 2 SATs Results for 2010/11 – 2012/13

Below is a table detailing our results from the last 3 academic years. The expectation is that children achieve a minimum of level 2 at the end of year 2 (with a good proportion achieving a more secure level 2b or better) and level 4 at the end of year 6. Some children will be working above this expectation by achieving level 3 in year 2 or level 5 in year 6. Schools are also judged on the percentage of pupils achieving 2 levels of progress between year 2 and year 6 eg moving from a level 2 to a level 4. All pupils with matched data (ie results of KS1 and KS2 tests) are included in this percentage including children who take their KS1 tests elsewhere and have joined the school after the start of year 3. Levels 3 (in year 2) and 5 (in year 6) are the maximum achievable results in these assessments. From 2012 it was possible to achieve level 6 in Year 6 through undertaking a separate test.

All results are given as percentages (national figures are in brackets)

The format of the testing and reporting of results changed in 2013. Prior to this the results of reading and writing tests were combined to give an English level. In 2012 the writing element became a teacher assessment of ongoing work rather than a test. In 2013 outcomes were reported in reading and writing separately rather than as an English level. Likewise the percentage achieving Level 4 or 5 in English and maths was replaced by those reaching standards in reading, writing and maths. Also in 2013 a new test was introduced in spelling and grammar. There is no progress measure for this test as there was no comparable test for the children when they were in KS1.

Level 6 Tests

In 2012 Level 6 tests were introduced. The content of the tests is normally what you would expect of someone in Year 8 or 9 at secondary school, therefore relatively few children take these tests. Below are the school results since 2012.

National figures are rounded – 0% means less than half of one percent passed the level 6 test rather than no children at all.

From 2012 Year 1 pupils undertook phonics testing. Results are published as the percentage meeting the expected standard.
