

Service Pupil Premium Funding

Service Pupil Premium (SSP) is extra funding for schools so that they can offer mainly pastoral support during challenging times and to help mitigate the negative impact on Service children of family mobility or parental deployment. The school receives funding which is currently equivalent to £300 per service child.

At Glebe, we use the SSP in a number of ways, including targeted support to help service children to catch up or go over topics they have missed by moving, but we predominantly focus on looking after the general wellbeing of your child and supporting the challenges they face due to their parent serving in the British Armed Forces. They are eligible as long as they have been registered as a service child at any point since 2011.

Please Note: Following advice from the Government, we do not use SSP to subsidise routine school activities such as trips, music lessons, extra-curricular clubs, etc. or for before or afterschool care places.

We have a team that consists of a Pastoral Support Worker and two Service Family Support Workers, both of whom are from service families. Their role, which is in part paid for using SSP, is to support families in not only emotional well-being but also to sign post them to other agencies and help access local services.

Total Funding Available for 2017-18: £14,100

Full Time Pastoral Support Worker & Service Family Support Workers

Overview: Regular 1:1 sessions with a specialist adults to support emotional needs, particularly during times of deployment.

Aim/Outcomes: Children feel emotionally supported and their emotional literacy develops. Their self-confidence and happiness improves.

Cost: £10,000 per year

Transition In – All About Me

Overview: Children who are new to Glebe have 1:1 or small group sessions to create an *All About Me* book and regular follow up.

Aim/Outcomes: Teacher gets to know how the child learns, their likes and dislikes as well as the family situation so the child can settle as soon as possible.

Transition Out – My Passport & Memory Book

Overview: Children who are leaving Glebe have 1:1 or small group sessions to create a Passport to take with them to their new school. Children look at the school they are going to in order to prepare them for the change

Aim/Outcomes: Children who are leaving Glebe have a memento of their time spent with us and their friends write them messages wishing them well.

Well Being

Seasons for Growth

Overview: Group support for pupils who have experienced a significant loss or separation in their lives.

Aim/Outcomes: Children feel emotionally supported and able to discuss their loss, identify the emotions associated with loss and move forward emotionally.

Cost: £1,716.20

Lego Therapy

Overview: Group based sessions used to promote team work, build confidence in small group sessions using Lego building blocks and instructions.

Aim/Outcomes: Children's self-confidence grows as they take on roles of responsibility to achieve a set task. Children develop communication skills, develop emotional understanding and how to behave with others in social situations.

Cost: £1,789.20

Parental Engagement

Coffee Mornings/Afternoon

Overview: Families of service children are invited to regular coffee mornings or afternoons to meet with key staff and other service families.

Aim/Outcomes: Families have the opportunity to meet with other families and those new to Glebe can obtain information and be supported in accessing local services.

Full Time Pastoral Support Worker & Service Family Support Workers

Overview: Our Pastoral Support Worker and 2 Service Family Support Workers are available to meet with parents at the beginning and end of the school day.

Aim/Outcomes: Families have the opportunity to discuss any worries or concerns they have with them so they can support them as well as their child/ren.

Academic

Catch Up Sessions

Overview: Regular Interventions for pupils who have missed out on being taught certain concepts or topics due to mobility.

Aim/Outcomes: Service children are not disadvantaged academically due to being a service child. Pupils feel confident and gaps in their learning are closed.

Cost: £1,789.20

Celebration/Promotion

Camo Day/Red White and Blue Day

Overview: On alternate years we raise money for SSAFA through Camo Day and Red, White and Blue Day. This also serves to raise the profile of our military families.

Aim/Outcomes: To promote the culture and context of service children within the school.
