

## English:

Children will look at a variety of classic texts such as *Five Children and It*, *Woof* and *Carrie's War*; they will develop their understanding of formal and informal language. They will also spend time writing their own fantasy story.



Children will also cover...

-Diary entries and letters: Showing empathy for characters within a story and writing from their point of view.

-Writing like an author: Examine how different authors use language. Imitate their style when writing a different version of a chapter or story.

-Non-chronological reports: Linking Literacy with our topic on Earthquakes and writing information leaflets using appropriate layout and language features.

-Recounts: Retelling and reporting events in different contexts. Using paragraphs and connectives to sequence ideas effectively.

## PE: -

Tag Rugby and other games to develop hand/eye coordination, team work, agility, tactical and spatial awareness.



## Computing: -

Designing an interface for an app. Create an app that year 6 can use.



Music: - Composition – using iPads to create contemporary music

## Mathematics:

Calculate the area and perimeter of 2d and 3d shapes. Begin to understand the concept of volume and surface area.

Work with statistics and data. Present and interpret data in bar graphs, line graphs and pie charts. Some children will move on to scatter graphs. Venn and Carroll diagrams will be revised and used to sort shapes and numbers. Find the mode, median and mean averages and decide which is most appropriate.

Learn angle facts and find missing angles in 2d shapes. Practice using a protractor to measure angles and draw shapes accurately.

Solve problems involving time and learn to read a variety of timetables presented in different ways.

Solve multi step word problems in a variety of different contexts.



# Year 6 Curriculum Map Spring 2019



## Geography: - 'Earthquakes, volcanoes & Tsunamis'

Learn about the structure of the Earth. Discover how volcanoes and earthquakes are caused and the role of plate tectonics. Learn about the effect that natural disasters have on the population. Develop map skills; including using longitude and latitude to locate volcanoes.



## RE: - 'Christianity': describe the interiors and exteriors of Christian religious buildings, explaining how they influence worship.

Investigate the symbolic meaning of objects inside the church. Learn about the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ at Easter.



PSHE: - 'Say No To Bullying': Explore different types of bullying. Empathise with other people. Explore ways of preventing bullying.




## SATs week 2019:

## Science: 'Animals'

(including humans): Describe the human circulatory system and the different components of blood, .e.g. platelets, red blood cells...
