All day Nursery children have been learning lots of Teddy bear rhymes. We have been very busy and have completed loads of Nursery Rhyme related activities.

Next week is National Story Telling week, we will be reading lots of stories and making up lots of fun stories of our own. We will be reading 'The Gruffalo' and 'We're going on a Bear hunt', amongst others. All day nursery children will also be looking at the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'.

This week we have been watching some episodes of 'Numberblocks' on Cbeebies Iplayer. The children have loved learning all about the numbers and some parents have asked for more details, the episodes are five minutes long and will help with the idea of simple addition and number recognition.



We will also be learning about measurement, using the terms long, longest, short and shortest and in the water the terms full, half-full and empty.

Lots of children completed our Nursery Rhyme Challenge. Certificates will be given out next week. Well done to those children who were brave enough to sing eight Nursery rhymes to the staff.
